



John Ehiri, PhD, MPH, MS, is Professor and Director of the Division of Health Promotion Sciences MEZCOPH at the University of Arizona. He has both behavioral science and quantitative research/training experience nested within the topics of evaluation, health promotion, and disease control.

Dr. Ehiri has an MPH (Health Behavior) and a PhD in Evaluation from the University of Glasgow, Scotland. He also holds an MSc (Economics) degree in Health Policy and Planning from the University of Wales, Swansea.

Dr. Ehiri is a gifted educator. Dr. Ehiri was a finalist for the President's Award in Teaching Excellence in 2005 and the recipient of this award in 2006. He has several years of experience in curriculum development and mentoring of public health professionals. He was Director of Studies for the Master of Community Health (MCommH) degree program at the Liverpool School of Medicine, England, where he mentored several mid-to-senior level health professionals in community health, health services research and program design and evaluation. He also served as the chair of the MCommH Board of Studies for 3 years and represented the International Health Division at Liverpool University's Teaching & Learning Committee.

Dr. Ehiri has published more than 60 articles on various critical issues in MCH. His recent book, "Maternal and Child Health: Global Challenges, Programs and Policies" is the first comprehensive textbook that is entirely devoted to the topic of global maternal and child health.
